The presentation will be given by Mr. Miyako Itchu, the 14th generation head of the Itchu Bushi school of musical performance, recognized by the Japanese government as an Important Intangible Cultural Heritage. It will be in workshop form with demonstrations of *shamisen* performance accompanied by an explanation of the traditional narrative.

The program: Matsu-no-Hagoromo (The Celestial Robe on Pine)

The Matsu no Hagamoro is a well known traditional performance based on the Japanese version of the worldwide "swan maiden" myth. In the Japanese version, a fisherman steals the robe of feathers but returns it to the maiden in response to her entreaties. She dons the robe of feathers and returns to heaven demonstrating that, unlike humans, a heavenly being cannot lie and cannot remain on earth. The workshop format will combine the performance with an explanation of the narrative and the music and will offer an opportunity to deepen your knowledge of Japanese culture.
